He chose to retire last fall and we all wish him well and we hope he enjoys his well-deserved retirement. This resulted, however, in our town electing Jim Love as our new Highway Superintendent. Jim officially began his new position on January $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of this year, however, the Town Board appointed him Superintendent as a temporary position after the election to fill in until his actual start date. This time gave him the opportunity to learn the "ins & outs" of the position & a head start on working with the Highway Crew.

Jim has brought a fresh new insight into the Highway Superintendent position. He and his crew have been cleaning, painting & changing some of the light fixtures in the shop.

He petitioned to get a plow installed on the "Superintendent" truck & in doing so, he has been able to clean up our Intersections & any drifts that would normally have to be done with our costlier 10-Wheeler Trucks. Jim has also requested bids for a new 1 Ton Dump Truck to replace the old one.

Jim has settled in very nicely and is available to assist Residents with any questions or concerns. Please do not hesitate to contact him directly.

In a "Shared Agreement" with the Town of Geneseo, we have hired a new <u>Town Assessor</u>, <u>Mr.</u> <u>Agostino (Augie) Mineo</u>. Groveland Town Court



Town Courts have earned the reputation as being the Courts "closest to the people". Town Justice duties include, but are not limited to, arraignment of felony and misdemeanor charges, presiding over misdemeanors and violations that are committed within the town's geographic

boundaries, issuing Orders of Protection, and presiding over civil cases such as small claims and landlord/tenant matters that may result in an eviction as well as a monetary judgment for tent that is back due. Groveland Town Court remains the second busiest Town Court in Livingston County. In 2016, Groveland Town Court processed 1,638 cases and reported over \$255,000 in revenue. Additionally, the Town of Groveland received approximately \$16,000 from the Traffic Diversion Program.

We are proud to announce, Thursday January 26, 2017, Judge Love was elected President of the Livingston County Magistrate's Association, Judge Livingston was elected as a Director, and Terri Rider was elected VP of the Livingston County Clerk's Association.

If you have not already done so, please stop by the Groveland Town Court and view the improvements that have been made. Our Court Clerk, Terri Rider, applied for and received \$19,000 through a Justice Court Grant. As a result, we have been able to remodel the restroom making it handicap accessible, and construct a spacious, soundproof room that will be used for Jury Deliberations, Attorney/Client conferences and an inmate holding room.
