• Board discussion continued regarding the water district project as there are many variables with the new grant funding. The town board is anxious to have further discussions of the pros and cons with Mr. Weis to move the project forward as they do not wish to hold this project up.

Supervisor Devine stated an email came from the Sons of the American Revolution regarding the repair of the monument at Ambuscde Park. There currently is a couple of chips in the monument they wish to have repaired along with adding to the monument "Never Forgotten" "Rochester Chapter, SAR" "15 September 2029". The wording is to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution. Lastly, they wish to replace benches that have fallen into disrepair due to weather over the years. SAR would pay for the cost of all items mentioned.

A motion by Councilmember Przysinda and seconded by Supervisor Devine to allow the repairs to the Ambuscade Park monument, engraving and bench replacements to be paid for by the Sons of the American Revolution. Motion Carried unanimously.

A motion by Councilmember Bean and seconded by Councilmember Przysinda to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:32 a.m. The next meeting will be the Yearend meeting December 27, 2024 @ 9:00 a.m. at the town hall and is open to the public. Motion carried unanimously.
